The Law Enforcement program provides the opportunity for Police Academy students and holders of the ACT 120 certification to earn an associate degree. During/ following completion of the mandated municipal police officer education and training through a police academy and successfully completing the ACT 120 certification exam, students complete additional general education credits leading to the award of an associate in applied science.
